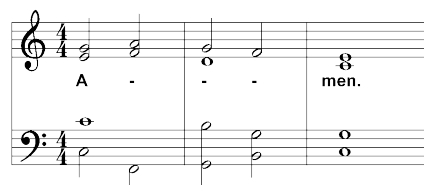

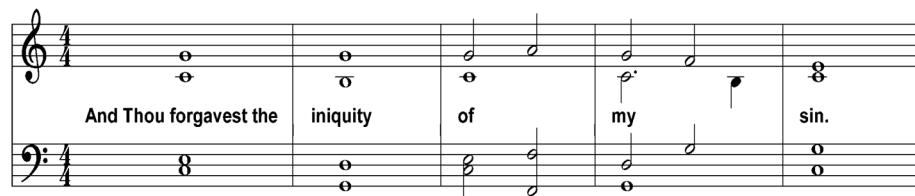

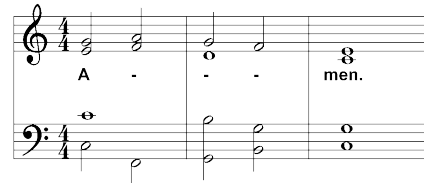

You have heard it with your own ears!” **12** Then Jeremiah said to all the officials and all the people: “The Lord sent me to prophesy against this house and this city all the things you have heard. **13** Now reform your ways and your actions and obey the Lord your God.
